- 2008- present **Color & Space Design**, Washington, DC. Owner. Color consulting and space design.
- 2001 – 2005 **Faculty, Landon School**, Bethesda, MD. Foundations level introduction to drawing, design, color, photography, printmaking, ceramics.
- 2000 **Faculty, Maryland Institute, College of Art**, Baltimore, MD. Elements of Visual Thinking/Color Phenomena. Introduction to basic design and color theory. Freshman Advisor. Admissions Portfolio Screening Committee.
- 1997-Present **Lecturer** Topics include Rites of Passage, Body Image, Social and Cultural Influences on Youth. Audiences include colleges, specific conferences, healing centers and book stores. My own mixed media prints are the source for these lectures.
- 1995-1996 **Faculty, Lecturer, Montgomery College**, Rockville, MD. Color Theory; Class encompassed academic, ethnic and spiritual understandings of color, color physics and self reflection of color in students lives.
- 1993-1995 **Faculty, Washington Waldorf School**, Bethesda, MD. Taught 10 & 11 grades the distinction between intaglio, serigraph, lithograph and relief printmaking techniques. A private visit with the National Drawing and Print Archives curators was mandatory. Hands-on class work focused primarily on screen printing.
- 1991 **Faculty, Rockville Arts Place**, Rockville, MD. Taught children's classes in drawing and printmaking. Classes encompassed life size portraits, drawing from imagination, introduction to rubbings, relief printing, footprints and monotypes.  
**Faculty, Maryland College of Art and Design**, Silver Spring, MD. Culminating class in a 4 semester program. Tied together all previously learned concepts and aimed to produce a coherent body of work. Portfolio produced was used as a tool to gain entrance into art programs beyond MCAD's 2 year program.
- 1990 **Faculty, Rockville Arts Place**. Designed and implemented a program which exposed participants to gallery exhibits, understanding the artist, their work and the materials they used. Participants were then given a chance to create something using equal or similar materials. Collaboration with BAPA (Bethesda Academy for the Performing Arts) allowed for a movement segment of the class. Participants ranged from pre-schoolers through high schoolers and nursing home residents.
- 1984-1992 **Owner, American Quiltworks, Inc.**, Gaithersburg, MD. Designed and marketed commercial and one-of-a-kind quilts throughout the US and Europe.
- 1982-1983 **Manager, Wholesale Quilt Business**, Tricia Woo, St. Louis, MO. Oversaw the design, production and sales of a \$100,000 commercial quilt business, the Smithsonian Museum being one customer.
